2012-04-02	<p>Accounts: A total expenditure of £7096.12 was agreed for the month of March.</p>	
2012-04-03	<p>Cornwall Council Matters: Councillor Lugg thanked members for the card and good wishes for his speedy recovery. His treatment in RCH, Treliske had been very good but he felt all services were under resourced, leading to additional strain being put on staff. Cllr. Lugg expressed his regret at the resignation, from this Council, of Cllr. Garry Boardman, who, he felt, had contributed greatly to the Parish Council and especially to the Youth Council and construction of the BMX track. He suggested that a note be sent to Mr J. Welford expressing this Council's concern for the recent damage to his bungalow caused by the fire which had destroyed the roof of the property. Agreed.</p>	Clerk.

2012-04-05	<p>Delabole Cemetery: The Clerk reported that completion on the purchase of additional land could be expected on, or before, April 19th. As soon as completion was confirmed the builder would be instructed to re position the stone wall.</p>	Clerk.

2012-04-06	<p>Camelford Leisure Centre: Cllr. Jones was concerned that, due to a prolonged period of inactivity over the Easter Holiday, some of the impetus had been lost for the campaign to save the Leisure Centre. Funding from Cornwall Council was only guaranteed up to the end of July 2012 by which time a positive business plan would be essential for the future of the LC.</p>	
2012-04-07	<p>Committees: Councillors were reminded that all Committees would meet in Delabole Methodist Church Room at 7pm on 23rd April 2012, to reassess Standing Orders, Financial Risk Management, Playing Field and Cemetery Management.</p>	
2012-04-08	<p>Correspondence: None at this time.</p>	
2012-04-09	<p>Meetings Attended: Cllr. E. Jones, Cllr. A. Hopkins and the Clerk had met with Paul Allen, CC, and opened discussions concerning the future of the public toilets in Delabole. Several options were put forward. Following clarification on various points from Mr Allen, negotiations would be ongoing in the near future for the transfer of responsibility for the day to day maintenance of this facility by St Teath Parish Council if, and when, the terms agreed are favourable.</p>	
2012-04-10	<p>Matters of Public Interest: Cllr. J. Tidd: The 'kissing gate' to fields in Trevilly Lane had still not been widened. Clerk to contact owner again. Cllr. Tidd felt that the new recycling scheme (run by Cory) was ill thought out and unworkable. It was member's opinion that such a large, countywide scheme would take time to 'bed in' and some tolerance / patience should be exercised to allow time for the new system of refuse and recycling collection to be rolled out across all areas to the satisfaction of all concerned. Cllr. A. Hopkins asked Council's approval for a Jubilee Project being planned by Mr Robert Round and residents of Newhall Green. Detail: Creation of a picnic area by the stream, at the entrance to the village. It was resolved that: Local opinion should be sought, ownership of land should be investigated and Environment Agency approval obtained. This Council had no objection provided the above conditions were met. Cllr P. Clark was aware that a book shop was to open at the property previously known as 'Delabole Stores'. He had been approached by the new proprietor who requested that double yellow lines be extended past the premises to stop parking which, he felt, would obscure his window from passers-by. Advised to contact Cornwall Council. Cllr. P. Clark also wanted it brought to Council's attention that the proliferation of 'fly posting' on telegraph poles was unsightly and illegal. Clerk to highlight this in the next issue of The Slate magazine. Cllr. L. Rose informed Council of a 'Tidy Britain' campaign aimed at owners who do not pick up after their dogs. He felt the posters he had seen to back this campaign were eye catching and could be an asset in this parish. Clerk to investigate on-line supply.
