2011-06-01	<p>Apologies: Cllrs. J. Tidd, G. Keat. Minutes: Proposed acceptance, Cllr. G. Boardman Seconded by Cllr. G. Aston. Matters arising. One amendment namely, under decisions received 'unanimous' should read 'majority'. AGM. Chairman and Vice Chair stood down. Cllr. P. Hicks took 'the Chair'. Cllr. G. Boardman proposed, Cllr A. Stacey seconded. Cllr Jones as Chairman. There were no other nominations. Agreed unanimously. Cllr. A. Hopkins nominated Cllr. Boardman to serve as Vice Chairman. Cllr. Boardman refused this nomination on personal grounds. Cllr. Boardman nominated Cllr. Hopkins to stand as Vice Chair. Cllr Hopkins accepted this nomination. Seconded by Cllr. R. Morey. 2011-06-02	<p>PA11/03519. Removal of store building and construction of toilet/shower room. 114, High Street, Delabole. CC approved.</p> <p>PA11/02652. Installation of 4kw solar photovoltaic electricity generating system, Long Hay, Treligga. CC approved.</p> <p>Contractor: Jason Mc Dougall reported that despite his recent absence from the Parish he would be able to catch up with his work programme over the coming week, weather permitting. All, to his knowledge, was well around the Parish.</p>	
2011-06-03	<p>PCSO Report: In the absence of any police presence there was no report at this time.</p>	
2011-06-04	<p>Cornwall Council Matters: Cllr. J. Lugg reported the outlook for the Leisure Centre in Camelford was not looking promising, meetings were still taking place to investigate all possible avenues of new management structure which could prove viable for the way ahead. Cllr. Lugg handed the Chairman a document 'Legal Structures for Social Enterprise' which set out seven alternative legal structures under which a leisure centre could be run. Two core elements of any future financial input were CC's decision to withdraw funding and of Sir James Smith's Schools intention to become a Trust run school, as a result of this they would no longer be prepared to part fund the leisure centre in future. Cllr. Lugg reported his optimism for the future of services at Bowithick Recycling Depot. Its future would appear to be safe for the foreseeable future. He was also pleased to tell councillors that a recent central government u-turn on the privatisation of The Forestry Commission would secure the continued public access of several areas of forestry land in the County. Cllr. A. Stacey asked what level of losses are being experienced by CC in its running of Newquay Airport? Cllr. Lugg could not quote figures as it was not within his remit. He assured members that eventually it would show a profit and, in all probability, show a very handsome return when sold off into private ownership. Cllr. Jones asked that the annual accounts for the airport be obtained for members to study. Localism. It was to be hoped that a joint venture with Camelford Town Council would move Localism forward in this area. Cllr. Lugg asked to be excused for leaving the meeting early as he wished to visit Mr Paul Burden who was now progressing well following his recent serious illness. Councillors passed on their good wishes for Mr Burdens continued recovery.</p>	Cllr. Lugg.
2011-06-05	<p>Cemetery: All was well at this time although no further progress had been made to acquire and extension of land.</p>	
2011-06-06	<p>Footpaths: It was again reported that, despite this Council's effort to educate dog walkers to 'pick up after' their dogs there was still a pressing need to reduce the amount of dog mess being left on footpaths around the parish. More notices to be put up, more articles to be put in 'Slate' and 'Timepiece' and more warnings of possible legal action to be brought against those owners who fail to 'clean up' when out walking. Dog walkers would also be reminded to keep their dogs on the lead when walking in areas where livestock are present.</p>	Clerk.
